An entirely new technology based on a lighting concept by the Kardorff Ingenieure company has been installed at this old town hall, which was built in 1911. For the first time, it enables a facade to be directly illuminated without any glaring of the environment or its users. This elegant lighting requires less than 1 W per square metre of facade area. At a height of just 7 metres, the multi-functional luminaire poles project discreetly yet attractively from the patented ICI system (Intelligent City Instruments).
